



Operaria, medicinae practica, et anatomica, Editio septima, Lugduni [= Lyon], Antonius & Joannis Postel, 1710. 4to. With 3 engraved plates, including the famous one showing two tarantulas, 3 woodcut illustrations in the text, numerous woodcut decorated initials, some headpieces built up from typographic ornaments and some floral woodcut tailpieces. Contemporary brown sprinkled calf.

Expertly engraved illustrations of (funerary) monuments of renowned men from Classical Antiquity until the 15th- and 16th centuries



With engraved allegorical frontispiece, 125 full-page numbered engraved plates (including 88 with text on opposite page), and 2 full-page unnumbered engraved plates, all showing grave-stones and tombs of famous men. Contemporary gold-tooled overlapping vellum.






FOLENGO, Teofilo.

Opus Merlini Cocai poetæ mantuanii macaronicum. Amsterdam [possibly printed in Naples?], Abraham van Someren, 1692. 8vo. With a full-page engraved portrait of the author as a frontispiece, 26 engraved illustrations in the text (ca. 6 x 5 cm), a woodcut decorated initial, and woodcut floral and ornamental tailpieces. Early 19th-century elaborately gold-tooled black morocco, with a floral frame on both boards, detailed floral designs in the compartments of the spine and the title, year of publication, and name of the binder lettered in gold on the spine, gold-tooled board edges and turn-ins, gilt edges, marbled endpapers.

Antigho fisico-matematico con il nuovo orbe, e sistema terrestre. Livorno, Giovanni Vincenzo Bonfigli, 1664. 4to. With 66 woodcut diagrams and other illustrations in text. Modern limp sheepskin parchment, with 2 fastenings made from loops of braided cord on the front cover but only traces of thongs on the back.

In hoc volumine haec continentur. Herodiani Historiae. Libri VIII. Sexti Aurelii Victoris a d. Cesare Augusto usque ad d. Flavium Iulium. Eutropii Historiae. Libri X. Pauli Diaconi libri VIII. Ad Eutropiam additi. (Colophon) Florence, Filippo Giunta, 1517. 4 works in 1 volume. Small 8vo. With Giunta's woodcut device on the verso of the otherwise blank final leaf. Including:

(3) EUTROPIUS, Historiae libri X.

Later gold-tooled quarter calf, with a red morocco title label on the spine lettered in gold, decorative paper sides, marbled edges.
