# Offprints on American ornithology, with 22 plates

An extensive collection of offprints of articles about (North and South) American birds, from a wide variety of (mostly United States) journals from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Many include title-pages and most include wrappers with the title on the front. In one case, the author added illustrations that had been (to his annoyance) omitted from the article as published in the journal. Several of the journals are now very hard to come by. There is a manuscript contents list at the end.

In very good condition, from the collection of René Ronsil, author of the standard bibliography of French ornithology *Bibliographie ornithologique Française* (1948). Edges of a few offprints slightly tattered and the extremities of the spine a bit scuffed. A collection of offprints on American ornithology that would now be almost impossible to assemble.

# A very rare poem on shells and their moral properties

Very rare second edition of a pioneering Dutch renaissance poem on shells, comparable to Huygens's much later and much better known *Hofwijck* (1653). "If we compare both poets, Huygens has more to say and has a lot more twists than the repetitive Philibert, but the latter is nevertheless more poetic. Van Borssele sees with a painter's eye, speaks more beauty, is more courageous and less forced in his images and epithets, and gives more warmth to his verse" (Knuttel). Van Borsselen based his poems on the collection of shells of his brother-in-law, Cornelis Van Blijenburgh (1545–1618), but it's much more than just a dry enumeration and description. The poem was probably written before 1600 and first published in 1611. Both editions are equally rare.

The work is charmingly bound by the leading Brussels bookbinder Charles de Samblanx (1855–1943)."Son œuvre, extrêmement abondant et varié, offrait dans tous les genres des spécimens remarquables. Il avait contribué, pour une largo part, à maintenir dans notre pays l'art de la reliure au niveau élevé où l'avaient porté nos bons relieurs des périodes romantique et Second Empire" (Dubois d'Enghien).

With a library stamp. The bookblock is trimmed closely to the letterpress marginal notes, a few times touching a few letters, some minor foxing along the extremities and a restored tear in the last leaf, otherwise in good condition. The binding fine, with only the corners of the boards slightly rubbed.

# Fossils from the Brussels region, with 32 coloured plates

First and only edition of this careful study on fossils discovered in the region of Brussels by François-Xavier de Burtin (1743–1818). "Apparently, the first extensive book treating Belgium fossils and minerals" (Schuh). Burtin accurately describes fossil fishes, tortoises, echinoderms, worms, etc. and gives an analysis of the geological composition of the soils around Brussels. These descriptions are accompanied by fine illustrations, engraved in brown and coloured by hand, by A. Pris, J.A. Balconi, etc., after M. J. Speeckaert, Daveaux, etc.

The author studied medicine and natural sciences. He was doctor to Prince Charles de Lorraine, and was later appointed to the ruling council of the Netherlands, because of his excellent scientific work. With the arrival of the political upheavals of the latter part of the 18th century, he retired from public life to concentrate on science and writing. His interests were wide-ranging, and, in addition to geology, he wrote on agriculture and industry and was considered an authority on pictures, particularly the Dutch and Flemish schools.

The title-page slightly soiled and some occasional foxing in the margins, otherwise in good condition and wholly untrimmed. Binding rubbed.


## Classic work on orchids, with 772 chromolithographed plates

A nearly complete set of one of the rarest orchid iconographies, issued in a edition of 250 copies only. The illustrations were printed by Goffart after watercolours by Alphonse Goossens (1866–1944), one of the most prominent botanical artists of the period. The orchids are ordered according to genus and each plate is accompanied by a explanatory leaf, which sometimes includes small wood engraved illustrations of details of the flower.

Text leaves somewhat browned, a few plates slightly damaged around the margins. Front board of volume six detached. Otherwise in good condition. *BMC NH*, p. 362; Junk 1909; Nissen, BBI Supp. 2236n.

## Beech trees and beech forests

Very rare first edition of a treatise on the beech tree (*Fagus sylvatica*) by the French administrator and forester Étienne-François Dralet (1760–1844). It deals in particular with the beech in France, starting with its physical appearance (leaves, flowers, wood, etc.) and habitat. The second part deals mainly with the economic value of the tree, its wood and its beechnuts. It also includes an introduction to the management of a beech forest, with a chapter on beech forests in the north of France and another on forests in the south or up in the mountains. In 1801 Dralet was appointed as "curator" of the waters and forests of Toulouse, where he tried to restore to the state the forests that had fallen into private hands during the Revolution.



# First scientific study of the St. Pietersberg at Maastricht




First edition of the Dutch translation of a geological study of the St. Pietersberg near Maastricht, the Netherlands by Barthélemy Faujas de Saint-Fond (1741–1819), a French geologist and assistant of Buffon at the Museum of Natural History in Paris. When in the course of the French Revolution the Netherlands became part of France, Faujas de Saint-Fond came to explore the St. Pietersberg near Maastricht. He collected a mass of fossils, and published his natural history of the Sint Pietersberg, which represented the first scientific study about this now famous calcareous mountain. The work was richly illustrated with newly engraved plates showing the caves, fossils, and minerals. It became the favourite school book on the subject, especially in Limburg.

# Finely illustrated work on garden design and layout, first edition, with 46 engraved plates

First edition of a finely illustrated work on garden design and layout. The first 78 pages contain the *Essai*, which refers often to the illustrations bound in at the end of the work. The author gives a general introduction on gardens and objects which can be used for adornment, such as bridges, all sorts of buildings, fountains, etc. This part is followed by a section with tables of edible plants, ornamental plants, low, medium and high trees, bushes etc. Guiol specifies for each species the preferable type of soil, whether it needs sun or shade, height, colour, flowering time, etc. With the general indications, the information of the tables and the examples of possible layouts, labyrinths, bridges, pavilions, temples, fountains and other possible garden constructions, the reader is equipped with sufficient knowledge to lay out a garden.

With the engraved armorial bookplate of Lucas de Lestanville, that is probably Frédéric Louis Lucas de Lestanville (1790–1860). Binding rubbed, with some damage near the lower part of the hinge of the back board, spine discoloured, but still firm and with the spine still attractive. Internally in very good condition.

First and only edition of a practical cactus handbook by the German botanist Friedrich Adolph Haage junior. The first half of the book gives a general description of cacti, giving information on their cultivation, the proper soil, watering, fertilizing, diseases, etc. The second half consists of a list of different cacti species, ordered by genus.

With a manuscript note in ink on page 88. Second leaf restored in the gutter, some occasional foxing. Overall in good condition.

Rare first edition of an illustrated natural history book for the youth, written by Willem van Haarst (1785–1853), a school teacher at Sneek, Friesland. It teaches about mammals, birds, fishes, insects and reptiles, of which most are shown in the illustrations. The preface states that the author wrote the book because his other school books on natural science were so well received.

Binding discoloured, otherwise in good condition.


# Collection of Karsten's publications on mycology

Facsimile collection of numerous publications on fungi by the Finnish mycologist Petter Adolf Karsten (1834–1917). Most of Karsten's articles were published in different periodicals or as smaller booklets, which sometimes makes them quite difficult to consult. Here they are all together in 4 volumes. Karsten's research was essential to the knowledge of the fungi of Finland, not in the least by his exsiccatae which are found in almost every botanical museum in Europe. In very good condition.





# Horse and cattle breeding in Russia, with 23 photographs

Rare first and only edition of an account of a journey to Russia by a professor at the School for Agriculture in Ettelbruck in Luxembourg, with the purpose of studying farming and horse and cattle breeding in Russia. The book treats all aspects of Russian rural life, including the social and economic position of Russian farmers, the climate, soil, the buildings, the manner of cultivation, the various products of the soil, forestry, apiculture, the breeding of farm-horses and cattle, etc. Most of the photographs show Russian farm-horses and prize-cattle. The author also discusses the Agricultural Museums at Petersburg and Berlin, and tells about the founding of an Agricultural Museum near his own school at Ettelbruck.

With a presentation inscription on half-title: "A Madame Sophie de Bilderling | Hommage respectueux de l'auteur | Kunnen". Spine damaged, hinges weak and fly leaves detached. Slightly browned throughout, but text and photos otherwise in good condition.

It is so long since I have written any thing for this Journal, that I fear that many Members of the B.O.U., more especially those lately elected, may consider that the President is a myth, who never appears at the Annual Meetings, and merely exists as a sort of conventional fiction. # Birds of the Mediterranean, Lilford's own interleaved copy

Separately published edition of an article on the ornithological observations by the British ornithologist Lord Thomas Powys Lilford (1833–1896), made during a cruise in the Mediterranean region, especially the coasts of Italy. Lilford describes his journey, describing both the rare and the common species of birds he sees in different places, for example: "In the market at Naples I saw the following species of birds- common jay, chaffinch, serin finch, goldfinch, Italian sparrow, stonechat, skylark ..."(p. 11) and many more. Occasionally he catches some birds for specimens. Lilford also visited important museums and universities, commenting on their bird collections. The present is Lilford's own copy, interleaved with blue lined paper for comments and with Lilfords crowned L in gold on the spine. Spine discoloured, endpapers browned. Otherwise in very good condition.

# With colour-printed frontispiece cactus, mostly white on blue

Rare first edition of an unusual little cactus book, the first half devoted to taxonomy and the second to cultivation. The paper of the frontispiece has a bright blue surface coating with an extremely hairy cactus (Pilocereus senilis) overprinted in white, brown and green (the hair and the name at the foot in white), giving the impression of a painting. Parts seem indeed to have been hand painted. Although the book stands alone complete, with no evidence that a continuation was intended, it later appeared as two volumes, 1841–1844, the first apparently a re-issue of the original single volume. The reference works record copies both alone and with volume 2. The present volume was reprinted alone in 1995. Good copy. Slightly browned. An uncommon little cactus book with a remarkable colour-printed frontispiece illustration.

# Illustrated study of Fetal deaths by a pioneering veterinarian

Rare separate issue of Numan's study of pregnant horses, sheep and especially cows that fail to give birth after the normal gestation period, either as a result of or causing the death of the fetus. He also discusses the dangers to the mother. The illustrations show calf and lamb fetuses taken from slaughtered animals or naturally aborted, as well as the uterus and kidneys of a sheep with a long dead lamb fetus. The illustrations are very finely engraved, most with a note indicating the scale, by Daniel Veelwaard, probably the elder (1776–1851), and the whole luxuriously produced on excellent paper (the plates on wove paper by Jan Kool & Co.) with generous margins.

The present essay appeared both in the *Nieuwe Verhandelingen der eerste klasse van het Koninklijk-Nederlandse Instituut van Wetenschappen*, vol. 3 (1831), pp. 27–71, and in the present much rarer separate publication, where only the plates refer to the journal. It appears to have been overlooked in the medical and zoological literature.

In fine condition and virtually untrimmed. The wrappers are slightly damaged at the spine, but still very good. A beautiful copy of a rare and well-illustrated essay by a pioneering veterinary researcher.





First and only edition of Nikolai Michailovich Przewalski's (1839–1888) work on the comparatively small fish fauna of Western China, ca. 190 species. The work was published and edited by Salomon Markovich Herzenstein (ca. 1854–1894). This copy is from the collection of the well-known ichthyologist George Sprague Myers (1905–1985).

Library stamps and several manuscript notes. Very good copy, the titles reinforced on the reverse with paper, sometimes repaired with tape, a few inner margins reinforced.



# The most important and best illustrated work on Dutch lepidoptera, with 600 hand-coloured plates

One of the finest and best-illustrated works on butterflies and moths ever published, here together with the continuation by Snellen van Vollenhoven. Work on the publication probably began around 1728 and stopped only two hundred years later, when the author of the third series died in 1928, leaving his work unfinished: A. Brants, *Nederlandsche vlinders beschreven en afgebeeld* (The Hague, 1905–1928). He published only ten parts of the first volume of the third series, not included in the present set. That unfinished third series contained only 10 plates, while the present two series together contain 600 plates plus the 8 frontispieces where butterflies, moths, larvae and pupae on plants form a lovely frame around the title. Most plates show a single species of butterfly or moth in flight and on a plant, along with the larva and pupa, and many add the egg and further figures with anatomical details. "The most important work on Dutch *lepidoptera*" (Landwehr).

Some annotations and inserted notes. With occasional spotting, but otherwise in very good condition and largely untrimmed, preserving most deckles and with some bolts unopened. Bindings rubbed, some spines damaged. A celebrated and beautifully illustrated lepidopterological classic.

# Rare work on the cultivation and application of the sugarcane of China

First(?) edition of a work on the cultivation and applications of the Chinese sugarcane, here often called sorgho, written by Adrien Sicard (b. 1816), an agronomist and doctor from Marseille. Sicard, who tried to acclimatize the cane in France, deals with the cultivation, growth, ripening, structure and composition of the sugarcane, commenting on the extraction of juice from the cane, the cane's commercial value (the production of sugar, alcohol, wine, rum, vinegar), the study of its seed and more. Included at the end is a handcoloured plate, depicting 21 colours that can be produced from the Chinese sugarcane. With the ex-libris of Napoleon III, engraved by Emile Lesache, bound in. Some occasional minor stains, hand-coloured plate somewhat browned. Overall in good condition.

# From a series of "the finest engravings of flowers ever made" by the teacher of Redouté

Magnificent illustration of a *Antirrhinum majus*, commonly known as snapdragon, printed in colour and delicately finished by hand. This colourful flowering plant is native to the Mediterranean region and the Arabian Peninsula. It is originally part of a series of flower prints by Gerard van Spaendonck, the only engraved work published during his lifetime, "entitled *Fleurs dessinées d'après Nature*, which contains twenty-four magnificent drawings, brilliantly interpreted in stipple by P.F. Le Grand and other engravers. These are probably the finest engravings of flowers ever made" (Blunt) and "they are among the most breath-taking series of plates in the [Hunt] library" (Hunt). The series was originally published in 6 parts with 4 plates and available printed in black, printed in colour, or (as in the present case) printed in colour and finished by hand.

Gerard van Spaendonck (1746–1822) was a proponent of the Dutch school of floral painting. He singlehandedly transformed the genre of flower painting in France, where he managed to unite the realism of the Dutch school with the suave elegance of the French school. In 1780 he became Professeur de Peinture de Fleurs at the Jardin des Plantes. Among his many pupils was Pierre Joseph Redouté.

A few minor spots, some faint thumbing and a couple minor restorations to the lower margin, otherwise in very good condition.

# Plants of the botanical garden in Palermo

Very rare first edition of a description of the plants in the botanical garden in Palermo by Bernardino da Ucria (1739–1796), a Franciscan friar and botanist whose secular name was Michelangelo Aurifici. The work opens with a survey of Linnaeus's 24 classes and botanical terminology, followed by a description of the numerous species in the botanical garden according to its class, often referring to Linnaeus's description, and sometimes noting where the species can be observed in nature in Sicily. Da Ucria also comments on the pharmacological applications of the plants. The work concludes with four indices: Latin plant names, medicinal powers of the plants described, illnesses and the plants used to treat them, and Sicilian plant names. In very good condition, a few leaves somewhat browned.

Very rare first and only edition of an attractive suite of lithographs, limited to 150 copies, of the gardens at Beloeil, "the principal example in Belgium of the classical French style". "It was not until the mid-18th century, at Beloeil, that the French classical garden finally gained a firm hold in the Belgian provinces … the present gardens are the result of rearrangement made for the most part in the mid-18th century under Prince Claude-Lamoral 11 de Ligne, assisted principally by the French architect Jean-Baptiste Bergé…" (Oxford companion to gardens).

The suite is preceded by letterpress text, including a dedicational poem to the Princess de Ligne whose husband, Prince Eugène had commissioned the most recent additions to the gardens which included an orangery and rustic temple. This poem is followed by three parts, respectively describing the estate, the history of the grounds and castle and a brief history of the family.

Some minor stains on the first two pages and a few minor spots throughout, otherwise in very good condition. Binding rubbed along the extremities and spine damaged.


A beautiful, large watercolour drawing of a blue passion flower (Passiflora caerula, image 42 × 27 cm), by the Haarlem painter Jan Jansz. van der Vinne (1734–1805), showing a vine with two flowers fully opened and another closed, as well as numerous leaves, buds and runners. The passion flower is indigenous to South America, but became a popular ornamental plant in Europe due to its exotic and spectacular appearance. Jan Jansz. van der Vinne no doubt learned to paint from his father Jan van der Vinne (1699–1753), a member of the Haarlem painters' guild best known for his flower and landscape drawings. Before Jan Jansz.'s botanical drawings came to light he was best known for his landscape drawings and etchings, but it now appears that his flower drawings were his most important work.
